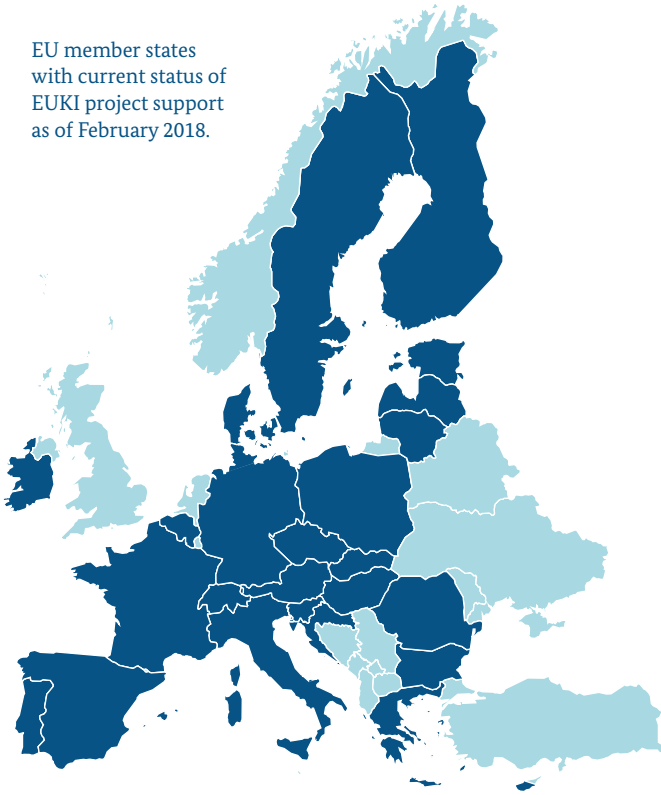

EUKI Project Examples

Urban Redevelopment in Lithuania

The project qualifies and trains managers for urban redevelopment in 20 municipalities of Lithuania. That way, the efforts of Lithuania in the development and implementation of long-term building restoration and climate strategies are put into practice in a sustainable manner.



Climate Schools in Athens

The project aims to improve energy efficiency in pilot schools in Greece involving teachers, students, parents and local government. The goal is to improve energy efficiency in the participating schools through training measures, awareness raising and the development of a municipal action plan.
