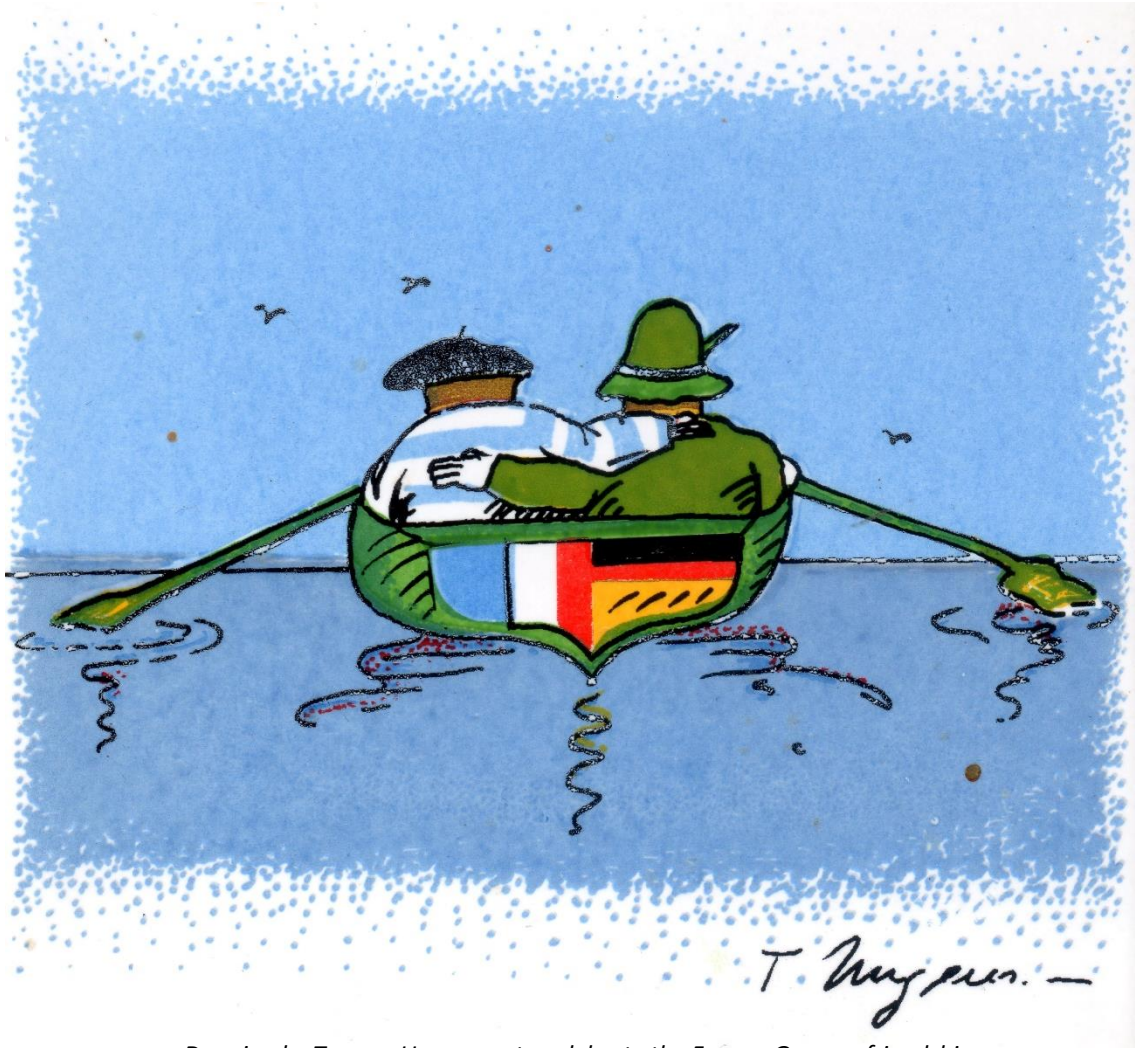

From 17 to 27 January 2019, more than 100 local authorities, associations and energy agencies from France and Germany organised actions to mobilise citizens around the energy transition.

Ecology transition alphabet

In Nancy, participants discovered the "Franco-German digital Ecological Transition alphabet" created by students from Nancy and its twin city, Karlsruhe. By evoking daily life topics related to the energy transition, the aim was to motivate young people to get to know the partner country and raise awareness, in a playful manner, about current ecological issues and challenges.
